Reclassification is the process whereby a student is reclassified from English learner (EL) status to Fluent English Proficient (RFEP) status. Reclassification can take place at any time during the academic year, immediately upon the student meeting all the criteria. However, since the most recent scores must be used to reclassify students, once a student takes the ELPAC, the scores from that administration of the assessment must be used to reclassify the student.

Steps to Reclassify



1. Assessment of English Language Proficiency

- Summative ELPAC Overall Performance Level 4

2. **Teacher Evaluation of Academic Performance (the CDE is currently developing a standardized resource)**

- The student is meeting grade level district progress monitoring indicators in ELA **and** Math, Social Science or Science on the current report card.

3. Demonstration of Grade Level Basic Skills

- The student must have a score of Proficient or Advanced on the most current assessment. Proficient on the NWEA assessment is a score at the 61st percentile or higher.

4. Parent Consultation

- Parent consultation can occur by phone, school platforms, or other available technology to discuss eligibility for reclassification. Parents must be in agreement before the student is reclassified.
