What Can You do to Help Your Child Stay on the Path to Positive Behavior?

- Review BUC P.R.I.D.E with your child
- Ask your child about his/her day at school every day
- Make sure your child is prepared for school every day
- Provide a quiet time and space for your child to do homework nightly
- Keep in touch with your child's teacher
- Encourage your child to use appropriate language and tone
- Practice positive phrases with your child, such as, "Thank you," "Excuse me," "Please," and "I'm sorry"
- Be a visible part of your child's school day. Attend school meetings and other school activities as your schedule allows

What is Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports (PBIS)?

PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) is a school wide approach to discipline and process for creating safer and more effective schools. PBIS is a systems approach to enhancing the capacity of schools to educate all children by developing research-based, school wide, and classroom discipline systems. The process focuses on improving a school's ability to teach and support positive behavior for all students. With PBIS, instructional time is more effectively used for teaching and the overall school environment is calm and conducive to learning.
