The Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and the California Department of Education (CDE) granted Mayfair a full-term accreditation, confirming to colleges and universities and the general public that Mayfair meets rigorous qualitative criteria. Our professional development focus campus-wide is Direct Interactive Instruction, or DII, Thinking Maps, Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports, or PBIS, and Professional Learning Teams, or PLT's, where teachers collaborate weekly to share best practices, analyze data, and focus on student success. Our vision includes parents and the community as an integral part of the educational process. ## GRADE REPORTING & CLASS RANK

The academic school year consists of two semesters. Each class meets five days a week for about 58 minutes per day. There are a total of 180 instructional days in the school year. Mayfair High School also offers an extended school day (zero and seventh period) as an option for students.

The value of each grade for computing unweighted grade point average is A = 4, B = 3, C = 2, D = 1, and F = 0. Honors and AP courses earn an extra point towards grade point average so A = 5, B = 4, C = 3 (only A, B and C grades will receive weighted credit). Class rank is based upon the student's cumulative grade point average in grades 9—12.
