<p>Practice counting to 120 by 1s, 10s, 5s, and 2s.</p> <p>Read a book to your favorite stuffed animal.</p>	<p>Write numbers from 1-120.</p> <p>Read a book under a tree.</p>	<p>Use 11 paper bags and write a number from 0-10 on it. Make flashcards for addition math facts. Students find the sum of each fact and place it in the matching bag.</p>	<p>Use 11 paper bags and write a number from 0-10 on it. Make flashcards for subtraction math facts. Students find the difference of each fact and place it in the matching bag.</p>	<p>Sort coins from your piggy bank and make a chart of how many pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters you have. How much money did you save?</p>
<p>Make sight words flash cards. Place them face down in rows and columns. Flip a card over and read it. If you read it correctly, keep the card.</p>	<p>Sort sight word flashcards in ABC order.</p> <p>Make a paper airplane and fly it outside.</p>	<p>Play a different version of "Sight Words Around the World." Place 10 different household items or souvenirs around the room as spots for traveling around the world. Have a parent show you a sight word flashcard. If you read it correctly, you can travel to the next spot.</p>	<p>Place sight word flashcards around the room. Do a fun walk to collect a sight word that your parents say. Some examples are penguin walk, crab walk, robot walk, floss and walk, walk with high knees, and crawl.</p>	<p>Play "Find the Fish Game" using sight words flashcards. Place the cards with words facing up in rows and columns. Have a family member hide a picture of a fish under one sight word. Read the sight word correctly to check if the fish is hiding under that card.</p>
<p>Write a story about a time when you were happy.</p> <p>Play a board game with your family.</p>	<p>Write a letter to someone.</p> <p>Find your favorite book and read it to someone.</p>	<p>Read a story. Write your own ending to the story.</p> <p>Play a card game with your family.</p>	<p>Read a book out loud using different voices such as robot voice, pirate voice, squeaky voice, and low voice.</p>	<p>Watch a movie. Then write about your favorite part.</p> <p>Play a video game with your family.</p>
<p>With an adult, mix water and oil in a clear container. What happens when you stir it? Then add 5 drops of food coloring. Watch what happens.</p>	<p>Make bubbles with an adult. Mix 2 cups of water, 1/4 cup of dish soap, 1 tablespoon of light corn syrup. Tie some straws in a bunch to make a bubble wand. Play bubbles outside.</p>	<p>With help from an adult, fill a cup of water and mark the water line on the cup. Put the cup outside and predict what will happen. Observe it once every hour.</p>	<p>Have an adult mix $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of vinegar and 1 teaspoon of salt into a bowl. Place some brown, old pennies in that bowl for a few minutes. Watch what happens.</p>	<p>Observe the sky. What do you see? Identify shapes and pictures in the clouds.</p> <p>Build an obstacle course and see how long it takes for you to complete it.</p>
